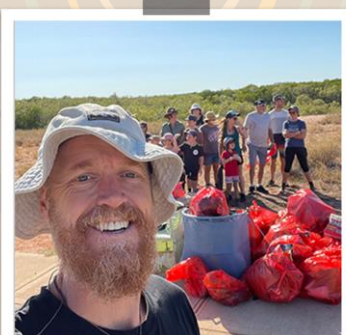

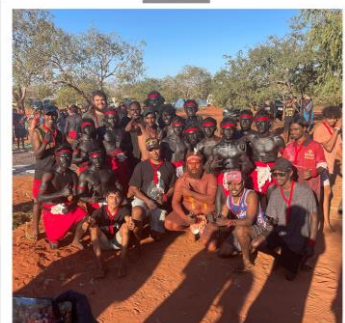

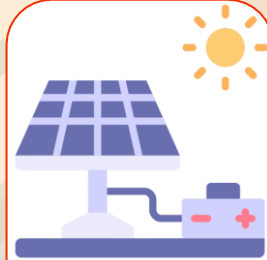

➔ **Mijilmilmaya Project Wish List**

The Mijilmilmaya Project is committed to supporting the creation of sustainable, culturally significant community spaces. Aligned with the vision of preserving heritage while ensuring comfort and safety, the project aims to address essential infrastructure needs that promote community cohesion and development.

This project requires the following

1. Bore Installation & Purification:

A reliable bore system is crucial for providing a consistent and sustainable water source to meet daily requirements. This will support drinking, cooking, watering and sanitation needs, enhancing the overall quality of life for the community.

2. Plumbing Systems:

Proper **plumbing** will ensure effective water distribution across all areas of the project, including residential, community, and recreational facilities. A well-implemented system is key to maintaining hygiene and convenience.

3. Power Supply:

Reliable **power** infrastructure is essential for supporting lighting, cooking, and other everyday utilities. This project aims to implement an energy-efficient power, ensuring that the community has access to electricity in an eco-friendly manner.

4. Sewage Management:

Developing a proper **sewage system** is crucial to maintain hygiene and prevent health issues. The project will implement a waste management plan that aligns with environmental standards and community practices.

5. Groundwork Preparation:

Comprehensive groundwork is needed to prepare the land for various facilities. This includes clearing, leveling, and setting foundations for buildings, ensuring safety and stability.

6. Gunyahs (x 10):

Constructing **Gunyahs** – traditional designed **Aboriginal shelters** – will serve as both residential and community spaces. With a plan to build **10 units**, these structures will provide culturally significant and practical living spaces for families.

7. Community Cook House:

The **Cook House** will serve as a communal area for meal preparation and gatherings. This space will be equipped with cooking facilities to support large-scale meal preparations for events, ceremonies, and day-to-day living.

8. Toilets Facilities:

The project includes the construction of designated toilet facilities across different community areas:

- Play Area: 1 toilet
- Community Area: 6 toilets
- Men's Area: 2 toilets
- Women's Area: 2 toilets

Having separate and sufficient facilities ensures convenience and privacy for all community members.

9. Shower Facilities:

To support hygiene and well-being, the project will implement shower facilities in the following areas:

- Community Area: 3 showers
- Men's Area: 2 showers
- Women's Area: 2 showers

These facilities will provide a comfortable environment for everyone, with appropriate design. 13

➔ **Bolo Project Wish List**

1. Plumbing from Spring:

The project seeks to establish a plumbing system that taps directly into a natural spring, providing a clean and sustainable water source for the entire community. This system will supply water for daily consumption, cooking, and sanitation needs.

2. Power Supply:

A reliable power system is essential for the well-being of the community. The project will implement a robust power infrastructure that ensures electricity is available for homes, community spaces, and essential facilities like the Cook House and showers.

3. Sewage Management:

To maintain a healthy and hygienic living environment, the project will set up a proper sewage system. This system will manage wastewater effectively, preventing contamination and promoting environmental sustainability.

4. Groundwork Preparation:

Before the construction of the various facilities, comprehensive **groundwork** will be undertaken. This involves clearing the land, leveling it, and preparing it for the foundations of buildings, ensuring safety and structural integrity.

5. Gunyahs (x 4):

The project will build **4 Gunyahs**, traditional designed Aboriginal shelters, providing residential spaces for families. These culturally significant structures will serve as comfortable homes while preserving the heritage of the Bolo people.

6. Community Cook House:

A **Cook House** will be constructed as a central space for communal meal preparation and gatherings. This facility will allow the community to come together for daily meals, celebrations, and cultural events.

7. Toilets:

Adequate toilet facilities are essential for the comfort and hygiene of the community. The project includes the construction of toilets in various areas:

- Community Area: 6 toilets
- Men's Area: 2 toilets
- Women's Area: 2 toilets

These facilities will be placed strategically to ensure easy access and privacy for everyone.

8. Showers:

The project will include shower facilities to support hygiene and well-being, providing:

- Community Area: 3 showers
- Men's Area: 2 showers
- Women's Area: 2 showers

These showers will be designed with the community's comfort in mind, ensuring a clean and accessible environment for all.

➔ Cable Beach Project Wish List

1. Bore Installation:

A bore will be installed to provide a reliable and sustainable source of water. This water supply will be essential for daily use, including watering, cooking, and sanitation for the community and visitors.

2. Toilet Facilities:

The project plans to install 10 toilets to accommodate the needs of the visitors. These facilities will be spread across key areas to ensure convenience and accessibility, promoting hygiene and comfort.

3. Shower Facilities:

To ensure cleanliness and well-being, the project will also include the installation of 4 showers.

➔ Terry Hills Project Wish List

The Terry Hills Project is designed to create a well-rounded, self-sustaining community hub that includes housing, food storage, and technology for meetings and operations. With the addition of tiny homes, a food-grade kitchen, media equipment, and a nursery office, the project aims to support the community's practical needs while promoting sustainability and growth.

1. Gunyahs:

The project includes the construction of 3 tiny homes to provide comfortable and eco-friendly living spaces. These homes will be designed to maximize efficiency and sustainability, offering a compact but functional living environment.

2. Food-Grade Kitchen and Cold Storage :

A food-grade kitchen housed in a shipping container will be installed to support safe and hygienic meal preparation. This facility will be equipped with cold storage, ensuring the community has a reliable place to store perishable goods and maintain food safety standards.

3. Media Equipment and Software for Meetings:

The project will invest in media equipment and software to facilitate virtual and in-person meetings. This setup will include cameras, microphones, projectors, and necessary software for smooth communication, collaboration, and presentations, supporting both internal and external community engagements.

4. Nursery Office and Storage (Shipping Container)

A nursery office and storage container will be set up to provide office space for managing nursery operations. The shipping container will also be used for storing tools, equipment, and other supplies necessary for maintaining the nursery, ensuring the efficient functioning of this essential part of the project.
